To protect children from any form of abuse (for example: physical, emotional, sexual neglect). *The Act* Includes mandatory reporting provisions.

Brief summary of the purpose/scope of the legislation:

Assures protection of personal information by public bodies (such as universities, colleges, crown corporations, provincial & municipal governments, schools and school divisions, etc.) and also allows individuals the right to access and request corrections to their personal information. Individuals who work for or relate to the entities that are covered by FIPPA should be aware of this legislation.

The Human Rights Code

The Human Rights Code prohibits unreasonable discrimination which is based on group characteristics such as ancestry, nationality, ethnic origin, religion, age, sex, pregnancy and other gender determined characteristics, sexual orientation, marital or family status, source of income, political belief, and physical or mental disability.

The Mental Health Act outlines the procedures and standards for admission and treatment within a psychiatric facility. The Act covers both involuntary and voluntary admission, as well as individuals on leave from the facility. This Act will override The Personal Health Information Act (PHIA) and therefore must be understood for those working with certain clients within mental health services.

Personal Information Protection and Electronic Documents Act (PIPEDA)

PIPEDA is a federal act, which takes precedence over provincial legislation in some aspects. It is intended to provide protection of personal information. This legislation is of significance to occupational therapists in private practice.
